FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

Our current policy has a zero deductible and premiums for the 12-month period for 2023 were \$97,500.00 for the Basic Sports Accident Policy and \$5,577.00 for the Catastrophic Policy, totaling \$103,077.00. Gallagher Student Health & Special Risk's total submitted bid for 2024, with a zero deductible, would result in a \$15,117.00 annual increase. The increase is attributable to a higher claims paid out versus premiums paid in ratio from calendar year 2022 to calendar year 2023.
